August 16, 1923 - November 17, 2014

Charlotte Synon, 91, of Antigo, formerly of Wabeno, died Monday November 17, 2014 at Eastview Medical and Rehabilitation Center in Antigo. She was born Aug 16, 1923 in Omak, Washington to George and Wilhelmina (Capes) Walker; she was their 4th child. They moved to the Wabeno area when she was four years old.

She married Joe Synon on November 22, 1945. He preceded her in death on October 24, 1997.

Charlotte worked at the post office in Soperton before she was married. After a few years they moved to Freedom and became farmers. Later they moved to a larger farm, renting it from Dr. Bauman (the dentist). While living there and helping out with the farm work, she also worked at Spark's store in Wabeno. Charlotte loved the farm - country life: the cows, pigs, chickens, and perhaps most of all, the garden. When Mary was going into the 3rd grade they sold all of their farm animals and machinery and moved into Wabeno where they lived for 57 years. During that time she was head cook at the Wabeno school district. When she was 55 she retired and worked for a short time at the Blackwell Job Corps in the kitchen. Later she did housekeeping and cooking for Harry McGraw until his death, after which she retired and spent her time with the garden and flowers, and - in the colder weather – in the kitchen, making goodies for her family. She was an excellent cook and shared chocolate chip cookies with children and adults. She began her love of vegetable gardening when she was first married. Gardening has been her hobby, plus a source of delicious vegetables for many years. Also she grew the most beautiful flowers which she shared with the church to make the sanctuary beautiful for the morning services on many Sundays. Charlotte was a member of the Wabeno Presbyterian church, and was a member of the Ladies Aide.

Charlotte is survived by her daughter Mary and son in law Vernon, six grandchildren Joe and Fred (Patti) of Wausau, Randy (Nooshin) of Rocky Point NY, Erin (Jamie) Schauer of Galesville WI, Tim of Madison WI, Travis (Maia) of Oakland CA. and six great grandchildren: Clay, Rachel, Brook, Raen, Ty and Ingrid. She is further survived by one

sister Fredda (Jean) Bartlein of Laona WI and many nieces and nephews.

A memorial service for Charlotte will be held on Saturday November 29, 2014 at 11:00 am at the Wabeno Presbyterian Church. Visitation will be from 10:00 am until the time of service at the church. Rev. Lee Jenings will officiate. Burial will be in the Wabeno Cemetery at a later date. Weber-Hill Funeral Home is assisting the family with arrangements.

Charlotte was a sweet friendly person and was loved and will be missed by her family and lots of friends.
